At the same time, we have begun to lay firm foundations for the future and this publication you will read of new members of the team who are helping to strengthen our safeguarding work.


I want to thank them personally for the ways in which they are already improving our ministry and care. But there is still much to do.





IMPROVEMENT BOARD

Safeguarding Improvement Board Begins Journey Towards Cultural Shift

Following the Bishop's Review and the publication of the INEQE Audit, the creation of a Safeguarding Improvement Board is the first step on our journey to addressing "critical vulnerabilities" in the Cathedral's structure, operations and leadership.

The purpose of the Safeguarding Improvement Board is to work with the Cathedral Chapter and executive, providing challenge and support to achieve the aims of the Cathedral's improvement journey.

Barbara Peacock has been appointed as Chair of the Board. She is a social worker and senior strategic leader of children and adult services for different authorities. She has worked on improvement across children and adult services and has chaired boards for six years. She has worked in the voluntary sector, private sector and the NHS. She was also on the Jay Wilkinson reference group for the Church of England.

Other members of the Board are drawn from a professional community of interest including: The Cathedral's Interim Dean and Senior Non Executive Member of Chapter, The Church of England National Safeguarding Team, Diocesan Board of Finance, Bishop's Office, statutory bodies, local authorities and the charity sector.

The Board has confirmed their commitment to be intentional in their trauma-informed leadership as they embark on this improvement journey. They are committed to listening, hearing and engaging with the Cathedral community; congregation, victims and survivors, volunteers and staff to shape the future.

Safeguarding Adviser Appointment

Enhanced provision is an important step forward.

Lesley Hurst, a former police officer with extensive safeguarding experience, took up the role at the start of November.



Part of the Diocesan Safeguarding Team, she will be in the Cathedral each Tuesday and Thursday.

Lesleys' appointment forms part of a service level agreement with the Diocese. This covers comprehensive safeguarding support including training for both staff and volunteers, the investigation of any concerns raised and identification of all ways to improve the culture and safeguarding practices across all our activities. This arrangement with the Diocese also provides us with greater access to a range of specialist partners in the statutory and voluntary sectors.

Lords Prayer Tour

In October we welcomed the **Archbishop of York, Stephen Cottrell** and hundreds of people from across Lancashire to the Cathedral to explore the wonder and beauty of The Lord's Prayer.

It was the latest leg of the Archbishops 'Faith in the North' Lord's Prayer Tour, during which he is visiting all 12 dioceses in the Northern Province of the Church of England to speak and share the importance and relevance of the Lord's Prayer to our world today.



Those in attendance heard what the Lord's Prayer means to young people across the region; listened to the Cathedral Youth Choir perform an incredibly moving musical version of the Lord's Prayer; watched a series of inspirational videos; participated in discussions about their own experiences of using and saying the Lord's Prayer together.

Appeal Update

We give our grateful thanks to all those that have so generously supported the **Organ Appeal** since its launch earlier in the year. Our iconic organ is famous for its remarkable sound, innovative design and unique appearance and the Appeal aims to raise £250,000 to restore it to peak performance.

Progress Towards Net Zero

As part of our ongoing work towards achieving Net Zero 2030, we had a visit from committee members from the Cathedrals Fabric Commission who encouraged exploration into the addition of **solar panels** to the roof of the Nave.



We subsequently commissioned a structural engineers report

which confirmed the roof is suitable and helpfully provided us with estimates of likely energy generation once in place. Siting proposals are now being drawn up ahead of submission to CFCE for approval.



In Conversation with Sian Goggins, Enterprise Development Manager

She is the driving force behind the Cathedral's commercial development, responsible for the expanding events calendar and growing merchandising operation whilst also running the Cathedral's popular café, Checks & Greys.



A lot has changed in the three years you've been here, what's pleased you the most in this time?

Three years ago I walked into the Cathedral with a massive challenge ahead of me. The café was on it's knees, it was losing money and only serving around 30 customers a day and there was so much to do on the events front too.

Fast forward to today and you're lucky to get a table at lunchtime without pre-booking! Through all our activities like the events, the café, online delivery, catering and venue hire, we're now making significant contributions towards the Cathedral and that's really pleasing, as is the fact that we are able to provide real jobs with prospects, to people in the area.

What has been your proudest moment so far?

There's two that stand out for me:

Firstly, from a business point of view, booking the Museum of the Moon last year. There was a considerable up-front cost that we didn't know if we were going to get back and that was a big risk. But to see all our hard work bring in more than 40,000 guests in just four weeks and selling out every event we staged... was great!

And from a personal perspective, I think back to the Dean's Banquet in 2023. It was the first time I'd done something of that scale or importance before and it was the first time Head Chef Laura Palmer had cooked for that many people. The pressure was really on us but the three course, black tie dinner we delivered was a tremendous success and something that I look back on with great pride.

How do you ensure your team are ready for the challenges they face?

I find the key thing is planning. People like to know what's expected of them and having a day plan for the café or an operational plan and pre-briefings before a big event really helps make sure everybody knows what they're doing. Having the right people in the right place with the right leaders looking after them makes all the difference. It's all in the preparation!

What motivates you?

Coming from a commercial background, what motivates me might differ from others in the team. But it's really simple - bringing in worthwhile financial contributions to the Cathedral.

When the Cathedral is packed for a concert or full of guests at an exhibition for example, and we've exceeded expectations, it's really rewarding. Seeing our beautiful Nave when there's 600 people at a concert or we're hosting 250 guests enjoying a gala dinneryou can't beat that feeling when the team's hard work comes to fruition.

But as soon as it's over, there's no time to dwell, though, I'm already planning the next one!

What have you learnt along the way as you have developed our standing into one of the leading events venues in the region?

To be organised and stay on top of everything, all the time. We're a small team and know that being able to trust each other's expertise and ensure we communicate properly is key to the success that we've had. We work very closely with external partners too and that's really important.

We have some great relationships -be they suppliers to the café or event production companies. We know we have an iconic building but there's more to it than that. We've always been fair, open, honest, and flexible and are committed to being as accommodating as we can be, and that is one of the many ways we stand out against some other venues, both nearby and right across the region too.

How pleasing is it to see your team develop?

It's great and I take so much pleasure from it. In fact, a really good example is Ben - one of our café supervisors. He joined us at 16 as casual Saturday staff and has worked so hard to learn the ropes, he's really pushed himself into all aspects of the role. When I think back to his early days when he would walk around with his head down, barely speaking and then to look at him now when he's leading a team of sometimes eight to ten people on a shift. It's really satisfying. He's nearing the end of his Level 3 Hospitalilty Supervisor Apprenticeship and will soon be starting his Level 4 in Hospitality Management. I really hope to be able to put more people through apprenticeships to support them and encourage them to grow within the business.

Finally, what excites you about the future? What are you most excited about?

Obviously next year is a big one... with plans for a wide variety of events for our Centenary. But not just that, we'll continue to build growth in the busines by focusing more on the catering side of things and hosting more external events. The newly refurbished Crypt is a very special place and we're looking to expand our offering there too, with things like hosting wedding receptions and more private functions.

We'll continue to take calculated risks as we look to expand into new markets. It'll be important to continue building awareness in our offering as we develop the business further. This will allow us to take advantage of the growing demand for premium venues.

New Vestments For Centenary Thanks to Friends' Support

An exciting project to design and produce a complete set of new clergy vestments to mark the Cathedral's Centenary is well underway.

Following the four liturgical colours, the new vestments will explore themes from the Bible whilst weaving together ideas of community, unity, and the Trinity. Blending contemporary artistry with the traditional craft of hand weaving, they will be both beautiful and symbolic as they are worn during Cathedral worship throughout the year.

The vestments are being designed and woven by **Margo Selby**, the acclaimed British textile artist and designer whose work unites innovation and colour in striking ways. Many will recall Margo's project - *Breathing Colour* - which was displayed in the North Transept during The Festival of Making in 2024, and we are delighted that she will now bring her expertise and distinctive artistic vision to this significant collaboration.



Due to be completed in early 2026, the vestments will be unveiled as part of the Cathedral's Centenary celebrations at a special launch event planned for March. There will also be an exhibition called 'Fabric of Faith' celebrating the history of our vestments over the last century - details of which will be announced soon.

This is a wonderful way to mark our Centenary and we extend our grateful thanks to the Clergy team for their inspiration and input, Margo Selby Studio for their creativity and craftmanship and most importantly, **The Friends of Blackburn Cathedral** for their generous support that has made this project a reality.


