# The Service of Light

We gather around the new fire

The subdeacon carries the unlit Easter Candle

### The president says

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, on this most holy night, when our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life, the Church invites her children throughout the world to come together in vigil and prayer. This is the Passover of the Lord. We remember his death and resurrection by hearing his word and celebrating his mysteries, confident that we shall share his victory over death and live with him for ever in God

The president prays over the fire

Eternal God, who made this most holy night to shine with the brightness of your one true light. set us aflame with the fire of your love, and bring us to the radiance of your heavenly glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.** 

The president traces the cross and then the Greek letter Alpha (A) above

and the Greek letter Omega  $(\Omega)$  below.

As the vertical of the cross is traced the president says

Christ yesterday and today,

As the horizontal is traced the president says the beginning and the end, As the Alpha is traced Alpha As the Omega is traced and Omega,

As the first number of the year is traced the president says all time belongs to him,

As the second number is traced and all ages;

As the third number is traced to him be glory and power,

As the fourth number is traced through every age and for ever. **Amen.** 

The president inserts the nails into the Easter Candle,

reminding us of the five wounds of Christ, saying

By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our Lord guard and keep us. **Amen.** 

The president lights the Easter Candle, saying

May the light of Christ, rising in glory, banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.


The subdeacon bearing the candle enters the building, followed by the president and the people The deacon sings three times, and everyone responds

## The Exsultet

Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of angels! O Universe, dance around God's throne! Jesus Christ our King is risen! Sound the victorious trumpet of salvation! Rejoice, O earth, in glory, revealing the splendour of your creation, radiant in the brightness of your triumphant King! Christ has conquered! Now his life and glory fill you! Darkness vanishes for ever! Rejoice, O Mother Church! Exult in glory! Your risen Saviour, our Lord of life, shines upon you! Let all God's people sing and shout for joy.



Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is right and good that with hearts and minds and voices we should praise you, Father almighty, the unseen God, through your only Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who has saved us by his death, paid the price of Adam's sin, and reconciled us once again to you.

Glo - ry to you for ev-er.

For this is the Passover feast, when Christ, the true Lamb of God is slain, whose blood consecrates the homes of all the faithful. **Glory to you for ever.** This is the night when you first saved our ancestors, freeing Israel from her slavery and leading her safely through the sea. **Glory to you for ever.** 

This is the night when Jesus Christ vanquished hell, broke the chains of death, and rose triumphant from the grave. **Glory to you for ever.** 

This is the night when all who believe in him are freed from sin, restored to grave and holiness, and share the victory of Christ. **Glory to you for ever.** 

This is the night that gave us back what we had lost; beyond our deepest dreams, you made even our sin a happy fault. **Glory to you for ever.** 

Most blessed of all nights! Evil and hatred are put to flight and sin is washed away, lost innocence regained, and mourning turned to joy. **Glory to you for ever.** 

Night truly blessed, when hatred is cast out, peace and justice find a home, and heaven is joined to earth, and all creation reconciled to you. **Glory to you for ever.** 

Therefore, heavenly Father, in this our Easter joy, accept our sacrifice of praise, your Church's solemn offering, grant that this Easter candle may make our darkness light. For Christ the morning star has risen in glory; Christ is risen from the dead and his flame of love still burns within us! Christ sheds his peaceful light on all the world! Christ lives and reigns for ever and ever! **Amen!**

# The Liturgy of the Word

The president introduces the celebration, and then says

As we await the risen Christ, let us hear the record of God's saving deeds in history, recalling how he saved his people in ages past and in the fullness of time sent his Son to be our Redeemer; and let us pray that through this Easter celebration God may bring to perfection in each of us the saving work he has begun.

### **First reading**

### The Creation

### Genesis 1.1 – 2.4a Read by Dominic Eatwell

In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. Then God said, 'Let there be light'; and there was light. And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day. And God said, 'Let there be a dome in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters.' So God made the dome and separated the waters that were under the dome from the waters that were above the dome. And it was so. God called the dome Sky. And there was evening and there was morning, the second day. And God said, 'Let the waters under the sky be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear.' And it was so. God called the dry land Earth, and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas. And God saw that it was good. Then God said, 'Let the earth put forth vegetation: plants yielding seed, and fruit trees of every kind on earth that bear fruit with the seed in it.' And it was so. The earth brought forth vegetation: plants yielding seed of every kind, and trees of every kind bearing fruit with the seed in it. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the third day. And God said, 'Let there be lights in the dome of the sky to separate the day from the night; and let them be for signs and for seasons and for days and years, and let them be lights in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth.' And it was so. God made the two great lights-the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars. God set them in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth, to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day. And God said, 'Let the waters bring forth swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the dome of the sky.' So God created the great sea monsters and every living creature that moves, of every kind, with which the waters swarm, and every winged bird of every kind. And God saw that it was good. God blessed them, saying, 'Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth.' And there was evening and there was morning, the fifth day. And God said, 'Let the earth bring forth living creatures of every kind: cattle and creeping things and wild animals of the earth of every kind.' And it was so. God made the wild animals of the earth of every kind, and the cattle of every kind, and everything that creeps upon the ground of every kind. And God saw that it was good. Then God said, 'Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth.' So God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. God blessed them, and God said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth.' God said, 'See, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree with seed in its fruit; you shall have them for food. And to every beast of the earth, and to every bird of the air, and to everything that creeps on the earth, everything that has the breath of life, I have given every green plant for food.' And it was so. God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day. Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all their multitude. And on the seventh day God finished the work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all the work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested from all the work that he had done in creation.

### Second reading

### Crossing the Red Sea

Exodus 14.15 – 15.1a Read by Nigel Scales

Then the Lord said to Moses, "Why do you cry out to me? Tell the Israelites to go forward. But you lift up your staff, and stretch out your hand over the sea and divide it, that the Israelites may go into the sea on dry ground. Then I will harden the hearts of the Egyptians so that they will go in after them; and so I will gain glory for myself over Pharaoh and all his army, his chariots, and his chariot drivers. And the Egyptians shall know that I am the Lord, when I have gained glory for myself over Pharaoh, his chariots, and his chariot drivers." The angel of God who was going before the Israelite army moved and went behind them; and the pillar of cloud moved from in front of them and took its place behind them. It came between the army of Egypt and the army of Israel. And so the cloud was there with the darkness, and it lit up the night; one did not come near the other all night. Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea. The Lord drove the sea back by a strong east wind all night, and turned the sea into dry land; and the waters were divided. The Israelites went into the sea on dry ground, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left. The Egyptians pursued, and went into the sea after them, all of Pharaoh's horses, chariots, and chariot drivers. At the morning watch the Lord in the pillar of fire and cloud looked down upon the Egyptian army, and threw the Egyptian army into panic. He clogged their chariot wheels so that they turned with difficulty. The Egyptians said, "Let us flee from the Israelites, for the Lord is fighting for them against Egypt." Then the Lord said to Moses, "Stretch out your hand over the sea, so that the water may come back upon the Egyptians, upon their chariots and chariot drivers." So Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and at dawn the sea returned to its normal depth. As the Egyptians fled before it, the Lord tossed the Egyptians into the sea. The waters returned and covered the chariots and the chariot drivers, the entire army of Pharaoh that had followed them into the sea; not one of them remained. But the Israelites walked on dry ground through the sea, the waters forming a wall for

them on their right and on their left. Thus the Lord saved Israel that day from the Egyptians; and Israel saw the Egyptians dead on the seashore. Israel saw the great work that the Lord did against the Egyptians. So the people feared the Lord and believed in the Lord and in his servant Moses. Then Moses and the Israelites sang this song to the Lord:

Guide and strengthen us by the same Spirit, that we who are born again may serve you in faith and love, and grow into the full stature of your Son, Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit now and for ever. **Amen.** 

Please stand as the president stands and proclaims

Alleluia! Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia, alleluia.

Please extinguish your candles as the full cathedral lights are put on and an organ fanfare plays

The choir sings the refrain first which is then repeated at once by everyone and sung again after each section as indicated



Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.

## **New Testament reading**

(Romans 6.3-11)

### Read by Louise Hicks

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

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## The Gospel

The deacon says

(Mark 16.1-8)

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark. Glory to you, O Lord.

When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, 'Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?' When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, 'Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you.' So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

Please follow Bishop Philip and the candidates to the font in the South Transept and gather behind the candidates. The candidates stand in a line facing the font. Sponsors stand immediately behind them. Please bring your service sheets with you.

The choir sings

## The Easter Anthems

Christ our passover is sacrificed for us therefore let us keep the feast; Not with the old leaven, nor with the leaven of malice and wickedness but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

## Presentation of the candidates

The Bishop introduces the Liturgy of Initiation, and then asks the candidate for baptism

Do you wish to be baptised? I do.

The Bishop asks the candidates for confirmation who have been baptised

Have you been baptised in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit? *I have.* 

The Bishop asks all the candidates

Are you ready with your own mouth and from your own heart to affirm your faith in Jesus Christ? *I am.* 

The Bishop addresses the whole congregation

Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling. People of God, will you welcome these candidates and uphold them in their new life in Christ? With the help of God, we will.

## Decision

The Bishop addresses all the candidates

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light.

To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore I ask

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God? *I reject them.* 

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil? *I renounce them.* 

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour? I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord? I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life? *I come to Christ.* 

May God who has given you the desire to follow Christ give you strength to continue in the Way. **Amen.** 

## Signing with the Cross

The Bishop makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of the candidate for baptism, saying

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.

Do not be ashamed of Christ. You are his forever.

# Stand bravely with him against all the powers of evil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen.** 

## Prayer over the Water

Praise God who made heaven and earth, who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

### It is right to give thanks and praise.

We praise you, loving Father, for the gift of your Son Jesus. He was baptized in the River Jordan, where your Spirit came upon him and revealed him as the Son you love. He sent his followers to baptize all who turn to him. Now, Father, we ask you to bless this water, that those who are baptized in it may be cleansed in the water of life, and, filled with your Spirit, may know that they are loved as your children, safe in Christ for ever. **Amen.** 

## **Profession of Faith**

The Bishop addresses the congregation

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess together with these candidates the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist? I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son who took our human nature, died for us and rose again? I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world? I believe and trust in him.

**Baptism** 

The Sponsors introduce each candidate to the Bishop in turn, saying

Bishop Philip, I present N to be baptised.

The Bishop says to the candidate

N, is this your faith?

and answers

This is my faith.

The Bishop pours water on the candidate, saying

N, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

### Amen.

### The Bishop says

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church, pour upon you the riches of his grace, that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit, and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory. **Amen.** 

The Bishop invites the candidates for confirmation to make the sign of the cross on their forehead with water from the font in remembrance of their own baptism.

The Bishop says

Almighty God, we thank you for our fellowship in the house of faith with all who have been baptised into your name. Keep us faithful to our baptism, and so make us ready for that day when the whole creation be made perfect in your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen.** 

## Confirmation

The Bishop stands before those who are to be confirmed and says

Our help is in the name of the Lord who has made heaven and earth.

Blessed be the name of the Lord **now and for ever. Amen.** 

The Bishop extends his hands towards those to be confirmed and says

Almighty and ever-living God, you have given these your servants new birth in baptism by water and the Spirit, and have forgiven them all their sins. Let your Holy Spirit rest upon them: the Spirit of wisdom and understanding; the Spirit of counsel and inward strength; the Spirit of knowledge and true godliness; and let their delight be in the fear of the Lord. **Amen.** 

The sponsor lays a hand on the candidate's shoulder and introduce each candidate to the Bishop in turn, saying

Bishop Philip, I present N to be confirmed.

The Bishop addresses each in turn by name

N, God has called you by name and made you his own.

The Bishop then lays hands on the head of each, saying Confirm, O Lord, your servant N with your Holy Spirit. **Amen.** 

The Bishop anoints each candidate with Chrism saying

Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The Bishop invites the congregation to pray for all those on whom hands have been laid

Defend, O Lord, these your servants with your heavenly grace, that they may continue yours for ever, and daily increase in your Holy Spirit more and more until they come to your everlasting kingdom. Amen.

## Sprinkling with holy water

The Bishop sprinkles the congregation with holy water as a reminder of their baptism

## The Welcome

The Bishop says

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism: by one Spirit we are all baptized into one body. We welcome you in the fellowship of faith; we are children of the same heavenly Father;

The congregation greets those newly baptised and confirmed with applause



## **Eucharistic Prayer**

He has placed them once more in paradise and opened to them the gate of life eternal. And so, in the joy of this Passover, earth and heaven resound with gladness, while angels and archangels and the powers of all creation sing for ever the hymn of your glory:

### The choir sings

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of hosts, heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Glory be to thee, O Lord most high. Amen.

Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

The deacon says

Great is the mystery of faith: Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth. Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with Mary, Paul and all the saints to feast at your table in heaven. Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.

### Amen.

## The Giving of Communion

The president says

### Alleluia. Christ our passover is sacrificed for us. Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

When the stewards invite you to go forward, please approach the two communion stations for bread in single file along the side aisles of the Nave.

Please do come and ask this first minister for any blessings.

Communion is available in both kinds, and the minister distributing bread will say

The body of Christ. **Amen.** 

After receiving the bread, if you wish to receive wine please move to the station near the central aisle, and return to your place by the central aisle of the Nave.

The minister distributing wine will say

The blood of Christ.

### Amen.

If you do not wish to receive communion wine, please walk past that second distribution point, and return to your place by the central aisle of the Nave.

While you are waiting to go for communion you may wish to sit down.
