Reverend Father in God, we present to you Pete Baker and Paul Swarbrick, to be Installed as an Honorary Ecumenical Canons in accordance with the Statutes of this Cathedral Church.

*The Honorary Ecumenical Canon designates come and stand before the Bishop.
The Bishop says:*

Ecumenical Canons of this our Cathedral Church are appointed to honour and acknowledge an outstanding contribution made to the life of this our Diocese by a member of another Christian Denomination and to affirm our commitment to Ecumenical working. It belongs to the office of Ecumenical Canon, under the guidance of the Bishop and the Dean, to seek to contribute to the corporate life of this Cathedral Church and to promote its mission and service and extend its influence throughout the Diocese and region and to respond in good faith to such other points as are contained in the relevant Cathedral Statute.

The Bishop invites the people to pray in silence for a short period, after which he says:

Almighty and everlasting God,
by whose Spirit the whole body of the Church
is governed and sanctified:
hear the prayer we offer for these your servants
and for all your faithful people;
that in their vocation and ministry
they may serve you in holiness and truth
to the glory of your name;
through our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.
Amen.

The Bishop sits and reads the Deeds of Appointment, with each new Honorary Ecumenical Canon kneeling before him holding the Deed with both hands.

The Bishop then gives them the Deed, and taking his staff, blesses them, saying:

Receive our Commission as an Honorary Ecumenical Lay Canon in our Cathedral Church; in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Spirit of truth lead you into all truth, give you grace to confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, and strengthen you to proclaim the word

and works of God; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always.

The Bishop invites the people to pray in silence for a short period after which he says:

hear the prayer we offer for this your servant
and for all your faithful people;
that in her vocation and ministry

The Interim Dean presents the Honorary Canons designate to the Bishop saying:

Reverend Father in God, I present to you Lucy Ann Lunn and Damian Michael Porter to be installed as Honorary Canons in accordance with the Statutes of this Cathedral Church.

The Bishop says:

Brothers and sisters in Christ, before I collate Lucy and Damian as Honorary Canons of this Cathedral Church of Saint Mary the Virgin in Blackburn, they must make the Declaration of Assent and take the Oaths of Allegiance and Canonical Obedience.

The Church of England is part of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-Nine Articles of Religion, the Book of Common Prayer and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons.

In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation?

The Declaration of Assent

Standing before the Bishop, the new Canons say:

I, Lucy Ann Lunn; I, Damian Michael Porter, do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments I will use only the forms of service which are authorised or allowed by Canon.

The Oath of Allegiance

Facing the congregation, the Honorary Canons-designate, each holding a Bible in their right hand, swear the Oath of Allegiance.

I, Lucy Ann Lunn; I, Damian Michael Porter, do swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to His Majesty King Charles the Third, his heirs and successors, according to law: So help me God.

The Oath of Canonical Obedience

Facing the Bishop, the Honorary Canons-designate, each holding a Bible in their right hand, swear the Oath of Allegiance.

I, Lucy Ann Lunn; I, Damian Michael Porter, do swear by Almighty God that I will pay true and canonical obedience to the Lord Bishop of Blackburn and his successors, in all things lawful and honest: So help me God.

The new Canons stand before the Bishop, The Bishop invites the people to pray in silence for a short period after which he says:

Almighty God, who has given you the will to undertake all these things, give you also the strength to perform them; that he may complete that work which he has begun in you; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

The Bishop sits and reads the Deeds of Collation, the new Canons kneeling before him and holding the Deeds with both hands.

The Bishop presents the Deeds to the Canons, with these words:

Receive this cure, your care and ours. Be diligent in taking your part with your brothers and sisters of the College of Canons in the Government of this holy place, that here the word of God may be faithfully preached and the sacraments duly administered; and in all things so uphold the honour and dignity of our Cathedral Church that it may be a true Mother to the Churches of our Bishopric.

The Bishop takes his crozier and blesses them, saying:

God the Father strengthen you and increase your faith;
God the Son fill you with love and a spirit of service;
God the Holy Spirit guide you into all truth;
And the blessing of God Almighty, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, rest upon you and remain with you always.
Amen.

The new Canons stand and the Bishop hands them their Mandates saying:

Receive these Mandates, which you must hand to the Interim Dean in order that you may be Installed.

The First Lesson

(Numbers 21 4-9)

The first lesson is taken from Numbers Chapter 21

From Mount Hor they set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; but the people became impatient on the way. The people spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food.' Then the LORD sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died. The people came to Moses and said, 'We have sinned by speaking against the LORD and against you; pray to the LORD to take away the serpents from us.' So Moses prayed for the people. And the LORD said to Moses, 'Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live.' So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.

(Luke 14.27-33)

The second lesson is taken from Luke Chapter 14.

Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it? Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, saying, "This fellow began to build and was not able to finish." Or what king, going out to wage war against another king, will not sit down first and consider whether he is able with ten thousand to oppose the one who comes against him with twenty thousand? If he cannot, then, while the other is still far away, he sends a delegation and asks for the terms of peace. So therefore, none of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions.

The Installation

The new Canons are brought to the Interim Dean by the Canon Missioner of the Cathedral.

The Interim Dean says:

We accept these letters, but first you must make, in the face of this Chapter and of this congregation, the appointed declaration of obedience to the constitution and statutes of this Cathedral Church.

The new Honorary Canons make the Declaration following:

I, Pete Baker; I, Paul Swarbrick; I, Becky Gilbert-Rule; I, Lucy Lunn, I, Damian Porter; do declare that I will be faithful and loyal to this Cathedral Church of Blackburn and the Dean as its head. With the help of God and to the best of my power I will sustain my part in its life and work, recognising that the Cathedral is the seat of the Bishop and a centre of worship and mission. I will encourage all members of the Cathedral Foundation in their work and duties. I accept the Constitution and Statutes of this Cathedral and will duly observe them, so help me God.

The Interim Dean, attended by the Canon Missioner, leads the new Honorary Canons to their stalls in the Sanctuary.

and do hereby install and induct you as an Ecumenical Lay Canons in this Cathedral Church, with all the rights and dignities thereof, in the name of God. **Amen.**

The Interim Dean says to the new Honorary Lay Canon:

We, the Interim Dean and Chapter of this Cathedral Church receive you, Becky Gilbert-Rule as Lay Canon in this Cathedral Church

(Here he shall cause the new Lay Canon to sit)

and do hereby install and induct you as Lay Canon in this Cathedral Church, with all the rights and dignities thereof, in the name of God. **Amen.**

The Interim Dean says to the new Honorary Canons:

We, the Interim Dean and Chapter of this Cathedral Church, receive you, Lucy Lunn, Damian Porter, as Honorary Canons in this Cathedral Church.

(Here he shall cause the new Canons to sit)

and do hereby install and induct you to the Canonry of *Whalley and Bodeltone* in this Cathedral Church, with all the rights and dignities thereof, in the name of God. **Amen.**

The Interim Dean says:

God keep you in his care;
Christ win you and save you;
the Holy Spirit guide you in the paths
of truth and love always. **Amen.**

The congregation and new Canons remain seated; the Cathedral Choir, members of the Chapter and the College of Canons stand.

The Interim Dean addresses members of the Foundation:

The new Canons stand, and the Bishop says:


