

**ASHES TO GO:** Throughout the day on Ash Wednesday, 6<sup>th</sup> March, members of the clergy will be on Church St in Blackburn to offer people the opportunity to share in the beginning of Lent outside of the Cathedral walls. People will be offered the chance to receive the cross of ash as a token of repentance. The usual Ash Wednesday services will also take place, please see 'The Cathedral this week' for times.

**LENT GROUPS:** *Living Out Luke's Gospel* will be the focus of the Lent Course with four regular opportunities for you to take part all following the same material, running for five weeks:

Thursday Evening at the Cathedral, at 7.15pm **7<sup>th</sup> March** in Caedmon; Friday afternoon at the Cathedral, at 1.00pm on **8<sup>th</sup> March** in Caedmon, or

Monday Evening at a private address, near Revidge Road (time to be confirmed), starting on **11<sup>th</sup> March**; Tuesday Evening at a private address, near Ewood Park, starting at 7.30pm on **12<sup>th</sup> March**.

Please let Canon Pailing know if you wish to attend one of the courses (especially those held in private houses) in order to ensure you have all the information you need beforehand.

**COMPLINE:** The Gentlemen of the Cathedral Choir will be singing 'Compline by Candlelight' throughout Lent. This atmospheric service will take place on most Fridays in Lent, starting on the 8<sup>th</sup> March. Please check the Music List or bulletin for more information each week.

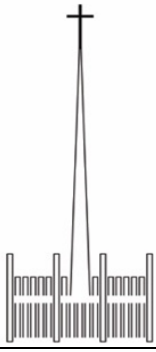
