TOWER OPEN MORNING: On Saturday, 15th September you can come and visit the Cathedral tower and learn a little about English Church bell ringing; you can even have a go if you want.

The Cathedral bellringers will be holding an open morning as part of the Heritage weekend. You can climb the 50 steps to the ringing room where there will be a brief introduction to what you can see. This is followed by a guided tour (sorry, a few more steps to climb) of the tower, the clock mechanism and a view of the Cathedral's fine ten bells. We end the tour with a demonstration of how bells are rung in the "full circle" style which is typical in Great Britain. Then there is a chance for anyone interested to have a go at ringing a bell. Tours will start every hour from 10.30 am to 1.30 pm and will last for about 45 minutes.
